CHARACTERISTICS OF THE GROWTH ENTERPRISE MARKET ("GEM") OF THE STOCK EXCHANGE OF HONG KONG LIMITED (THE "STOCK EXCHANGE")

GEM has been positioned as a market designed to accommodate companies to which a higher investment risk may be attached than other companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Prospective investors should be aware of the potential risks of investing in such companies and should make the decision to invest only after due and careful consideration. The greater risk profile and other characteristics of GEM mean that it is a market more suited to professional and other sophisticated investors.

Given the emerging nature of companies listed on GEM, there is a risk that securities traded on GEM may be more susceptible to high market volatility than securities traded on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange and no assurance is given that there will be a liquid market in the securities traded on GEM.

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This report, for which the directors (the "Directors") of Ningbo Yidong Electronic Company Limited collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on GEM of the Stock Exchange for the purpose of giving information with regard to Ningbo Yidong Electronic Company Limited. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that, to the best of their knowledge and belief: (1) the information contained in this report is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading; (2) there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement in this report misleading; and (3) all opinions expressed in this report have been arrived at after due and careful consideration and are founded on bases and assumptions that are fair and reasonable.

Notes:

1. Basis of preparation

The unaudited consolidated results of the Group have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRS") and Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("HKAS") (collectively "HKFRSs"), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong, the disclosure requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance and the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on the GEM of the Stock Exchange (the "GEM Listing Rules").

The accounting policies adopted in preparing the unaudited consolidated results for the three months ended 31 March 2010 are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the Group's annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2009.

The condensed consolidated results for the three months ended 31 March 2010 are unaudited and have been reviewed by the audit committee of the Company.

2. Revenue

The Group is principally engaged in the design, manufacture and sale of controller systems for various consumer electrical and electronic appliances and the assembly of mobile phones in the PRC. Turnover is stated net of value added tax, and revenues recognised during the period under review are as follows:

The Group is subject to an income tax rate of 25% on its taxable profit in accordance with the income tax law in the PRC (2009: 25%).

No provision for Hong Kong profits tax has been made as the Group has no estimated assessable Hong Kong profits for the period.

4. (Loss) per share

Loss per share is calculated based on the Group's loss attributable to shareholders for the three months ended 31 March 2010 of approximately RMB8,868,000 (2009: RMB5,553,000) and 500,000,000 (2009: 500,000,000) shares in issue during the respective periods.

Diluted loss per share has not been presented as the Company has no dilutive potential ordinary shares during the periods.

5. Administrative expenses

During the period ended 31 March 2010, the Company has included in the administrative expenses of approximately RMB2,216,000 (2009: Nil) depreciation expense for the Properties, which comprise the Dormitories, the Factory Premises, the Office Premise and the Staff Canteen located in Yuyao City, Ningbo Zhejiang Province, the PRC as stated in note 6 below.

6. Subsequent event

As pursuant to the announcement dated 6 May 2010, the Company entered into the Sale & Purchase Agreement on 30 April 2010 in relation to the disposal of the Properties, which comprise the Dormitories, the Factory Premises, the Office Premise and the Staff Canteen located in Yuyao City, Ningbo Zhejiang Province, the PRC at a total consideration of RMB153,605,000. The completion of the Sale & Purchase Agreement is subject to the conditions as mentioned in the announcement.

DIVIDEND

The Board does not recommend payment of interim dividend for the three months ended 31 March 2010 (three months ended 31 March 2009; NILL).

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Financial review

For the three months ended 31 March 2010, the Group's turnover was approximately RMB933,000, representing a decrease of 90.6% as compared to the corresponding period in previous year (2009: RMB9,903,000), whilst there was loss attributable to shareholders of approximately RMB8,868,000, representing an increase of 59.7% as compared to the same corresponding period (2009: RMB5,553,000).

Business review

The sale of mobile phones was low due to high competition. Tight cashflow had limited the resources invested in operation and the management was identifying profitable opportunities before feeding fund for worthy expansion.

For the three months ended 31 March 2010, the Group recorded an unaudited gross loss of RMB932,000, and a gross loss margin of 99.9%, as compared to the unaudited gross margin and gross profit margin of approximately RMB855,000 and 8.6% respectively for the corresponding period in 2009. The decrease in the gross profit margin was mainly due to increase in competition.

The overheads showed an overall increase as compared to the corresponding period in 2009. Selling expenses increased by 15.1% to approximately RMB122,000 from RMB106,000 in the corresponding period last year, administrative expenses increased by 136.1% to

approximately RMB9,887,000 from RMB4,187,000 in the corresponding period last year, and finance costs decreased by 23.4% to approximately RMB1,956,000 from RMB2,554,000 in the corresponding period last year.

Prospect

The Group will diversify its production to reduce risks in individual segments. e.g. mobile phone, maintain and continue profitable operation as far as possible, and identify strategic partners. The strategies place investor return maximisation in the first place and keep risk-free progressing at all times. We expect a good year to come despite a loss is reported for the first quarter.

During the three months ended 31 March 2010, none of the Directors, chief executive (if any) (the "Chief Executive") or supervisors of the Company (the "Supervisors") or their spouse or children under the age of 18 was granted any right to acquire shares of the Company or any of its associated corporation (as referred below), or had exercised any such right.

The audit committee comprises three independent non-executive Directors of the Company, namely Mr. Pang Jun, who is the Chairman of such committee, Mr. Law Hon Hing Henry and Professor Fang Min.

The Audit Committee has reviewed with the senior management of the Company the accounting principles and practices adopted by the Group and discussed internal controls and financial reporting matters, including the review of the Group's unaudited consolidated financial statements for the three months ended 31 March 2010.
