FIRST QUARTERLY REPORT

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE GROWTH ENTERPRISE MARKET ("GEM") OF THE STOCK EXCHANGE OF HONG KONG LIMITED (THE "STOCK EXCHANGE")

GEM has been positioned as a market designed to accommodate companies to which a higher investment risk may be attached than other companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Prospective investors should be aware of the potential risks of investing in such companies and should make the decision to invest only after due and careful consideration. The greater risk profile and other characteristics of GEM mean that it is a market more suited to professional and other sophisticated investors.

Given the emerging nature of companies listed on GEM, there is a risk that securities traded on GEM may be more susceptible to high market volatility than securities traded on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange and no assurance is given that there will be a liquid market in the securities traded on GEM.

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This report, for which the directors of China Bio Cassava Holdings Limited (the "Company") collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on GEM for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The directors of the Company, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this report is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this report misleading.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

The Group recorded a turnover of HK\$1,656,000 for the three months ended 31 March 2016, representing an increase of 18.1% from the corresponding period of previous year.

The Group recorded loan interest income of HK\$746,000 from provision of financing services for the three months ended 31 March 2016, representing an increase of 44.3% from the corresponding period of previous year (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$517,000).

The Group recorded revenue of HK\$357,000 from sales and licensing of software and embedded system through online platform for the three months ended 31 March 2016, representing an increase of 21.8% from the corresponding period of previous year (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$293,000).

Packaged software sales for the three months ended 31 March 2016 was HK\$553,000, representing a decrease of 6.6% from the corresponding period of previous year (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$592,000).

The Group's total operating expenses for the three months ended 31 March 2016 totaled HK\$3,272,000, representing a decrease of 13.2% as compared to the three months ended 31 March 2015 (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$3,770,000).

The Group recorded a net loss attributable to owners of the Company for the three months ended 31 March 2016 of HK\$1,638,000 (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$2,388,000). Loss per share attributable to the owners of the Company for the three months ended 31 March 2016 was HK0.07 cent (loss per share for the three months ended 31 March 2015: HK0.10 cent).

The unaudited consolidated results for the three months ended 31 March 2016 and the comparison with last year are set out in the accompanying table.

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The shares of the Company are listed on the Growth Enterprise Market (the "GEM") of The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the "Stock Exchange").

The Company acts as an investment holding company. The Company and its subsidiaries (collectively referred to as the "Group") are principally engaged in the computer software and embedded systems development, sales and licensing of the software and systems, development of biotech renewable energy and the provision of financing services. There were no significant changes in the Group's operations during the three months ended 31 March 2016.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The unaudited condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA"). In addition, the unaudited condensed consolidated financial statements include applicable disclosures required by the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on GEM ("GEM Listing Rules").

The unaudited condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for certain financial instruments that are measured at fair value at the end of each reporting period.

Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for goods and services.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date, regardless of whether that price is directly observable or estimated using another valuation technique. In estimating the fair value of an asset or a liability, the Group takes into account the characteristics of the asset or liability if market participants would take those characteristics into account when pricing the asset or liability at the measurement date. Fair value for measurement and/or disclosure purposes in these consolidated financial statements is determined on such a basis, except for share-based payment transactions that are within the scope of HKAS 17, and measurements that have some similarities to fair value but are not fair value, such as net realisable value in HKAS 2 or value in use in HKAS 36.

3. REVENUE AND SEGMENT INFORMATION

i. Revenue

Revenue represents the amounts received and receivables that are derived from sales of goods to customers and interest income from provision of financing services.

Revenue reported above represents revenue generated from external customers.

There were no inter-segment sales during the three months ended 31 March 2016 and 31 March 2015.

Segment results represented the profit earned by or loss from each segment without allocation of central administration costs, directors' emoluments, interest income and other items not directly related to the relevant segments. This is the measure reported to CODM for the purposes of resource allocation and performance assessment.

b. Geographical information

All of the Group's revenue is derived from customers based in Hong Kong during the three months ended 31 March 2016 and 31 March 2015, and accordingly, no further analysis of the Group's geographical information is disclosed.

4. INCOME TAX EXPENSE

No Hong Kong profits tax has been provided in both periods as the Group did not generate any assessable profits arising in, or derived from Hong Kong during the three months ended 31 March 2016 (three months ended 31 March 2015: Nil).

No profits taxes have been provided for the subsidiaries which are operating outside Hong Kong during the three months ended 31 March 2016 as these subsidiaries have not generated any assessable profits in the respective jurisdictions (three months ended 31 March 2015: Nil).

5. LOSS PER SHARE

The calculation of the basic loss per share attributable to the owners of the Company is based on the consolidated loss for the three months ended 31 March 2016 attributable to the owners of the Company of approximately HK\$1,638,000 (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$2,388,000) and the weighted average of 2,482,150,000 (three months ended 31 March 2015: 2,482,150,000) ordinary shares of the Company in issue during the periods.

Diluted loss per share for the three months ended 31 March 2016 and 31 March 2015 are not presented because the existence of outstanding share options and warrants during the periods would have anti-dilutive effect on the basic loss per share.

6. INTERIM DIVIDEND

The Board do not recommend the payment of interim dividend for the three months ended 31 March 2016 (three months ended 31 March 2015: Nil).

BUSINESS REVIEW AND PROSPECTS

The consolidated turnover for the Company and its subsidiaries for the three months ended 31 March 2016, amounted to HK\$1,656,000, representing an increase of 18.1% from the corresponding period of previous year. Loss attributable to owners of the Company for the three months ended 31 March 2016 was HK\$1,638,000 (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$2,388,000). The loss per share was HK0.07 cent (three months ended 31 March 2015: loss per share HK0.10 cent).

The Group recorded loan interest income of HK\$746,000 from provision of financing services for the three months ended 31 March 2016, representing an increase of 44.3% from the corresponding period of previous year (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$517,000).

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Packaged software sales for the three months ended 31 March 2016 was HK\$553,000, representing a decrease of 6.6% from the corresponding period of previous year (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$592,000).

The Group's total operating expenses for the three months ended 31 March 2016 totaled HK\$3,272,000, representing a decrease of 13.2% as compared to the three months ended 31 March 2015 (three months ended 31 March 2015: HK\$3,770,000).

The results for the three months ended 31 March 2016 were considered satisfactory under the current economic environment. Sales and licensing of software and embedded systems and provision of financing services recorded a growth in profitability compared with corresponding period of last year. These results encouraged the management to continue with the current business strategies and continue to provide resources and supports for obtaining growth for the Group.

The Group currently does not have any commitment or future plans for material investments and capital assets.

Culturecom Holdings (BVI) Limited is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Culturecom Holdings Limited. Each of Culturecom Investments Limited, Culturecom Holdings (BVI) Limited and Culturecom Holdings Limited is deemed to be interested in 524,622,500 shares through its controlling interest (100%) in Winway H.K. Investments Limited.

Save as disclosed above, as at 31 March 2016, the directors of the Company are not aware of any other persons who had interests or short positions in the shares or underlying shares of the Company which were interested in 5% or more of the issued share capital carrying rights to vote in all circumstances at general meetings of any other members of the Group.

INTERESTS IN COMPETING BUSINESS

Mr. Chow Wing Tung, an Independent Non-executive Director, held share interests in Great Harvest Finance Limited which is principally engaged in the business of hire purchase car financing. Mr. Chow was therefore considered to have interests in businesses which complete or are like to compete with the businesses of the Group pursuant to the GEM Listing Rules.

As the businesses of the Company and the above entity are operated under separate management with no reliance (whether financial or business) on each other, the Group is able to operates its businesses independently of, and at arm's length from the competing entity.

Saved as disclosed above, none of the Directors, the controlling shareholders of the Company and their respective associates (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules) has an interest in a business which competes or may compete with the business of the Group.

PURCHASE, SALE OR REDEMPTION OF SECURITIES

The Company has not redeemed any of its shares during the three months ended 31 March 2016. Neither the Company nor any of its subsidiaries purchased or sold any of the Company's listed securities during the three months ended 31 March 2016.

CODE OF CONDUCT REGARDING SECURITIES TRANSACTIONS BY DIRECTORS

The Company has adopted a code of conduct regarding securities transactions by directors of the Company on terms no less than the required standard of dealings as set out in Rules 5.48 to 5.67 of the GEM Listing Rules. The Company has also made specific enquiry of the directors and the Company was not aware of any non-compliance with the required standard of dealings and its code of conduct regarding securities transactions by directors for the three months ended 31 March 2016.

CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

The Company is committed to maintain a high standard of corporate governance. Maintaining a good and solid framework of corporate governance will ensure the Company to run its business in the best interests of the shareholders. Throughout the three months ended 31 March 2016 under review, the Company has complied with the code provisions of the Corporate Governance Code set out in Appendix 15 of the GEM Listing Rules.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Audit Committee, with written terms of reference in compliance with code provision C.3.3 of the Code as set out in Appendix 15 of the GEM Listing Rules, currently comprises three independent non-executive directors, namely Mr. Chow Wing Tung, Mr. Ko Wai Lun Warren and Mr. Tse On Kin. Mr. Chow Wing Tung is the chairman of the Audit Committee.

The primary duties of the Audit Committee are to review and supervise the Group's financial reporting process and internal control procedures. The Group's unaudited condensed consolidated results for the three months ended 31 March 2016 have been reviewed by the Audit Committee together with management, which was of the opinion that the preparation of such results were complied with the applicable accounting standards and requirements and that adequate disclosures have been made.

APPROVAL OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements were approved by the board of directors on 10 May 2016.
