


CHARACTERISTICS OF THE GROWTH ENTERPRISE MARKET (“GEM”) OF THE STOCK EXCHANGE OF HONG KONG LIMITED (THE “STOCK EXCHANGE”)

GEM has been positioned as a market designed to accommodate companies to which a higher investment risk may be attached than other companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Prospective investors should be aware of the potential risks of investing in such companies and should make the decision to invest only after due and careful consideration. The greater risk profile and other characteristics of GEM mean that it is a market more suited to professional and other sophisticated investors.

Given the emerging nature of companies listed on GEM, there is a risk that securities traded on GEM may be more susceptible to high market volatility than securities traded on the Main Board and no assurance is given that there will be a liquid market in the securities traded on GEM.

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This report, for which the directors (the “Directors”) of Thiz Technology Group Limited collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on the Growth Enterprise Market of The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the “GEM Listing Rules”) for the purpose of giving information with regard to Thiz Technology Group Limited. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that, to the best of their knowledge and belief: 1. the information contained in this report is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading; 2. there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement in this report misleading; and 3. all opinions expressed in this report have been arrived at after due and careful consideration and are founded on bases and assumptions that are fair and reasonable.

SUMMARY

- The Group recorded a turnover of approximately HK\$1,454,000 for the nine months ended 31 December 2016.
- Loss attributable to shareholders was approximately HK\$3,717,000.
- The directors of the Company (the “Directors”) do not recommend the payment of an interim dividend for the nine months ended 31 December 2016.

RESULTS

The board of Directors (the “Board”) of Thiz Technology Group Limited (the “Company”) announces the unaudited condensed consolidated results of the Company and its subsidiaries (together the “Group”) for the three months and nine months ended 31 December 2016 together with the comparative unaudited figures for the corresponding periods in 2015 as follows:

Notes to the Accounts:

1. General information

The Company was incorporated as an exempted company with limited liability in the Cayman Islands under the Companies Law (Cap.22 Law 3 of 1961, as consolidated and revised) of the Cayman Islands on 6 December 2000. The Group engages in (i) property leasing; (ii) trading business; and (iii) an information technology industry. In which, it is a developer and provider of a range of Linux solutions including Linux operating systems, application systems run on Linux.

2. Basis of preparation

The unaudited consolidated results of the Group have been prepared in accordance with the new Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards (“HKFRS”) and Hong Kong Accounting Standards (“HKAS”) (collectively “HKFRSs”) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the disclosure requirements of the GEM Listing Rules. They have also been prepared under the historical convention.

The details of adoption of new and revised HKFRSs have been set out in the Company’s annual report for the year ended 31 March 2016.

The accounting policies adopted in preparing the unaudited consolidated results are consistent with those applied in the preparation of the Group’s annual financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2016.

The Group has not early adopted any new standards or interpretations that have been issued but are not yet effective.

3. Turnover and other revenues

Turnover represents the invoiced value of software development income and rental income, after allowances for returns and discounts and net of value added tax. An analysis of the Group’s turnover and other revenue is as follows:

5. Taxation

Hong Kong profits tax is calculated at 16.5% (2015: 16.5%) of the estimated assessable profit for the period and taxation for other jurisdictions is calculated on the rates prevailing in the relevant jurisdiction. No provision for taxation has been made as the Group incurred a taxation loss for the period.

Deductible temporary differences have not been recognised in these financial statements owing to the absence of objective evidence in respect of the availability of sufficient taxable profits that are expected to arise to offset against the deductible temporary differences.

6. Loss per share

The calculation of basic profit per share for the nine months ended 31 December 2016 is based on the loss attributable to owners of the Company of HK\$3,717,000 (2015: HK\$3,738,000) and the weighted average of 225,570,261 (2015: 225,570,261) ordinary shares in issue during the period.

INTERIM DIVIDEND

The Board does not recommend the payment of an interim dividend for the nine months ended 31 December 2016 (2015: Nil).

BUSINESS REVIEW

During the period under review, in addition to releasing the restriction on real estate transaction in the beginning of the year, the China government further implemented stimulating policies, including increasing investment in infrastructure project, in order to maintain economic growth. However, the central government also introduced structural reform of the supply front consisting of adjusting industrial structure, insisting on de-inventory, reducing production capacity and deleveraging so as to prevent economic bubble from bursting. Under the mixed effect of policies, China recorded a GDP growth rate of 6.8% in the fourth quarter last year (2016), representing a slight increase as compared to 6.7% in the third quarter, though annual GDP growth rate was 6.7%, representing a tiny drop as compared with the annual GDP growth rate of 6.9% for the previous year (2015).

The leasing business of office premises in Shanghai, PRC continued to be the principal source of the Group's revenue. The turnover remained stable in the first three quarters of last year as compared with the same period of previous year.

During the period under review, the low office vacancy rate in the Shanghai Pudong central business district supported the continuous and slight increase in office rental price within the district, while there was a little drop in office rental price in the Shanghai Puxi central business district due to a slight increase in office vacancy rate under more supply in market and competition.

PROSPECTS

Looking forward into this year (2017), structural reform and industrial transition will continue to create pressure to mainland China's economic growth. Maintaining economic growth and preventing economic downturn with fiscal and monetary policies depends more on the extent of such policies. Moreover, it is worthy to pay attention to the uncertainty arising from the new policies introduced by US President Donald Trump after his inauguration.

In the aspect of the office premises in Shanghai, as office rental price has been surging for the past few years, some enterprises have found it hard to bear. As enterprises moves out from central business district to periphery district, it is expected that the demand for office outside central business district will keep increasing.

In the coming year, the Group continues to hold prudent view and remains innovative, and actively looks for new development direction and objective. We hope to seek optimization of shareholders' interests and fulfill our corporate social responsibility.

Financial highlights

The Group's consolidated turnover for the nine months ended 31 December 2016 amounted to approximately HK\$1,454,000 (2015: HK\$1,310,000). During the period under review, loss from operations for the period was HK\$2,994,000 (2015: HK\$3,056,000). Further, loss attributable to owners of the Company for the period was HK\$3,717,000 (2015: HK\$3,738,000).

Gross profit for the Group increased from HK\$1,243,000 in 2015 to HK\$1,387,000 in 2016, due to the increase of software income and rental income.

Total operating costs were approximately HK\$4,407,000 (2015: HK\$4,389,000). Compare to the corresponding period of last year, the operating costs have increased by 0.4%.

Neither the Company, nor any of its subsidiaries has purchased, sold or redeemed any of the Company's shares during the nine months ended 31 December 2016.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Company has established an Audit Committee with written terms of reference in compliance with Rules 5.28 to 5.33 of the GEM Listing Rules. The Audit Committee comprises three independent non-executive directors, namely Ms. Lin Yan Jenny, Mr. Chu Meng Chi and Ms. Chan Mei Sze. The Audit Committee is chaired by Mr. Chu Meng Chi. The primary duties of the Audit Committee are to supervise the financial reporting process and internal control of the Company. The Audit Committee has reviewed the unaudited results of the Group for the nine months ended 31 December 2016 and has provided advice and comment thereon.

CODE ON CORPORATE GOVERNANCE PRACTICES

The Company applied the principles and complied with all the code provisions as set out in the Code on Corporate Governance Practices (the Code) contained in Appendix 15 of the GEM Listing Rules throughout the Period, save for the deviations discussed below.

CHAIRMAN AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Under the code provision A.2.1 stipulates that the roles of Chairman and Chief Executive Officer should be separate and should not be performed by the same individual. The division of responsibilities between the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer should be clearly established and set out in writing.

Mr. Wong Hoi Wong is both the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Company who is responsible for managing the Board and the Group business. The Board considers that, with the present board structure and scope of business of the Group, there is no imminent need to separate the roles into two individuals as Mr. Wong is perfectly capable of distinguishing the priority of these roles in which he has been acting. However, the Board will continue to review the effectiveness of the Group corporate governance structure to assess whether the separation of the positions of Chairman and Chief Executive Officer is necessary.

NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

Under the Code Provision A.4.1, all the non-executive directors should be appointed for a specific term, subject to re-election. At present, the non-executive Directors are not appointed for a specific term, but are subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Company's Articles of Association.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SECURITIES TRANSACTIONS BY DIRECTORS

The Company has adopted the code for securities transactions by the Directors set out in Rules 5.48 to 5.67 of the GEM Listing Rules as its own code of conduct regarding securities transactions by Directors. The Company confirmed that, having made specific enquiry from all Directors, the Directors have complied with the required standard of dealings and its code of conduct regarding securities transactions by the Directors for the nine months ended 31 December 2016.
