Profile of Directors, Supervisors and the Management

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

Mr. Li Peiying, 51, was appointed the chairman of the board of directors in October 1999. He is a graduate of the Graduate School of the Institute of Social Sciences of China in finance and banking.
