PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

During the year, property, plant and equipment amounting to approximately HK\$3 million were acquired by the Group for the expansion of operations. Details of movements in property, plant and equipment during the year are set out in note 11 to the financial statements.

2. **Subsidiaries**

At March 31, 2001, Mr. Ling Tai Yuk, John and Mr. Kong Ho Pak were beneficially interested in 1,550,010 and 664,290 non-voting deferred shares respectively in Koniko Company Limited ("Koniko"), a company incorporated in Hong Kong, which is an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of the Company.

The non-voting deferred shares practically carry no rights to dividends or to receive notice of or to attend or vote at any general meeting or to participate in any distribution on winding up.

At March 31, 2001, save as disclosed above, none of the directors, chief executives or their associates had any interests in the shares or any securities of the Company or any of its associated corporations as defined in the SDI Ordinance.

SUBSTANTIAL SHAREHOLDERS

At March 31, 2001, according to the register kept by the Company under Section 16(1) of the SDI Ordinance, the following parties had notified the Company that they were interested in 10% or more of the issued share capital of the Company:

DIRECTORS' AND CHIEF EXECUTIVES' RIGHTS TO ACQUIRE SHARES OR DEBENTURES

The Company has a share option scheme, details of which are set out in note 19 to the financial statements.

No share options have been granted since the adoption of this scheme.

Save as disclosed herein:

- 1. None of the directors or the chief executives or their spouses or children under the age of 18 had any right to subscribe for the securities of the Company, or had exercised any such right during the year; and
- 2. At no time during the year was the Company or any of its subsidiaries a party to any arrangements to enable the directors of the Company to acquire benefits by means of the acquisition of shares in, or debt securities (including debentures) of, the Company or any other body corporate.

DIRECTORS' INTEREST IN CONTRACTS OF SIGNIFICANCE

During the year, the Group paid rental charges amounting to approximately HK\$661,000 to Crown Regent Enterprise Limited, a company in which Mr. Ling Tai Yuk, John, a director of the Company, has a beneficial interest.

Save as disclosed above, no contract of significance to which the Company or any of its subsidiaries was a party and in which a director of the Company had a material interest, whether directly or indirectly, subsisted at the end of the year or at any time during the year.

DIRECTORS' INTEREST IN COMPETING BUSINESSES

In accordance with rule 8.10 of the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the "Stock Exchange"), Mr. Ling Tai Yuk, John, a director of the Company, is deemed to have an interest in a business that may compete with the subsidiaries of the Company in the garment industry, as mentioned below:

- 1. He is a director and a substantial shareholder of Casual Center Garment Industries Limited ("Casual Center"), which is engaged in the manufacture and trading of garments;
- 2. He is a director of Pace Fashion Industries Limited ("Pace Fashion") which has as its principal activities the rental of properties to companies engaged in the manufacture of garments, the trading of garments and the design and sale of sample garment products; and
- 3. He is the sole proprietor of Progressive Industries ("Progressive") which is engaged in the trade of fabric and garments.

The Independent Audit Committee is satisfied that there are sufficient internal controls to ensure that the Group is capable of carrying on its business independently of, and at arms length from, Casual Center, Pace Fashion and Progressive.

Save as disclosed above, the directors hold no further interest in any businesses that compete or are likely to compete, either directly or indirectly with the business of the Group.

CONNECTED TRANSACTION

During the year, the Group paid interest expenses amounting to approximately HK\$1,535,000 to a fellow subsidiary of Eastland Enterprises Inc., a former substantial shareholder of the Company.

CONVERTIBLE SECURITIES, OPTIONS, WARRANTS OR SIMILAR RIGHTS

The Company had no outstanding convertible securities, options, warrants or similar rights during the year or as at March 31, 2001.

PURCHASE, SALE OR REDEMPTION OF THE COMPANY'S LISTED SECURITIES

Neither the Company nor any of its subsidiaries purchased, sold or redeemed any of the Company's listed securities during the year.

PRE-EMPTIVE RIGHTS

There are no provisions for pre-emptive rights under the Company's Bye-laws, or the laws of Bermuda, which would oblige the Company to offer new shares on a pro-rata basis to existing shareholders.

CODE OF BEST PRACTICE

The Company has complied throughout the year ended March 31, 2001 with the Code of Best Practice as set out in Appendix 14 of the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on the Stock Exchange.

MAJOR CUSTOMERS AND SUPPLIERS

For the year ended March 31, 2001:

- 1. The Group's largest customer and five largest customers accounted for approximately 47% and 85% respectively of the Group's total turnover for the year.
- 2. The Group's largest supplier and five largest suppliers accounted for approximately 44% and 71% respectively of the Group's total purchases for the year.

According to the understanding of the directors, none of the directors, their associates or any shareholders who owned more than 5% of the Company's share capital had any interest in the five largest customers or suppliers.

POST BALANCE SHEET EVENT

Details of significant event which took place subsequent to the balance sheet date are set out in note 33 to the financial statements.

AUDITORS

Messrs. Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu have acted as auditors of the Company for the past three years. A resolution will be submitted to the forthcoming annual general meeting of the Company to re-appoint them.
