The Norwegian Cruise Line vessels have undergone tremendous change in 2001. The fleet has been reinforced with new tonnage with the arrival of Norwegian Star and Norwegian Sun. The brand is making a strong comeback in the North American market and is presently enjoying a revival and rejuvenation following the successful introduction of “Freestyle Cruising” aboard its fleet (excluding the Norway) in 2001 which has gone down well with cruisers.

Norwegian Cruise Line’s eight vessels include the Norwegian Star, Norwegian Sun, Norwegian Sky, Norwegian Sea, Norwegian Majesty, Norwegian Dream, Norwegian Wind and the Norway. The 91,000-grt Norwegian Dawn - twin sister ship of Norwegian Star - is expected to be delivered in December 2002.
