## Major Events of the Year 2005



### January

- Wang Guang Dao, Minister of Construction of the PRC, inspected the Hong Kong Disneyland project undertaken by the Group.



### February

- A signing ceremony for Design and Construction for the Renovation of Libraries Phase 1 was held at the Architectural Services Department on 22 February 2005.

### March

- The works commencement ceremony for Asia Airfreight Terminal Expansion was held with a total contract amount of HK\$1,109 million for the project.
- The contract for the project of A New Infectious Disease Centre at Princess Margaret Hospital was officially signed.
- The Group won various Considerate Contractors Site awards for the Hong Kong construction industry, including five Considerate Contractors Site Awards, four Site Cleanliness and Tidiness Awards and four Outstanding Waste Management Performance Grand Awards.
- The Group's offices got the "Gold Wastewi\$e Scheme Logo" at the Wastewi\$e Scheme presentation ceremony held at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre in Wanchai, making it the first construction company winning this honour in Hong Kong.
- The Group won various prizes of the "Construction Safety Award Scheme".
- Mr. William Tsang won the bronze prize of the 8th Hong Kong Building Manager of the Year Awards of BYMA 2004 organised by the Chartered Institute of Building (Hong Kong) for the construction of Building 4, Science Park at Pak Shek Kok, Phase 1b.



### April

- The Group successively won various projects, including Enterprise Square 5, NKIL 5927 Kowloon Bay, Redevelopment of Members Stand I Building (Phase A) at Happy Valley and Construction of Centre for Youth Development at Chai Wan.
- Mr. Sun Wen Jie, Honorary Chairman of the Group, and Mr. Zhou Yong, Vice-Chairman and CEO, called on Mr. Edmund Ho Hau Wah, Chief Executive of Macau.
- The Group's various civil engineering sites won four overall "VG" (the highest score for performance) Infrastructure for Penny's Bay Development - Contract 1, Infrastructure for Penny's Bay Development - Contract 2, Castle Peak Road Improvement between Ting Kau and Sham Tseng, Tsuen Wan and Design and Construction of the Approach Viaduct to the New Boundary Bridge between Lok Ma Chau and Huanggang and Associated Works in the quarterly report on the performance of building contractors issued by the Environment, Transport and Works Bureau of the Hong Kong Government.



### May

- Won the bid for the of East - West Corridor in the State of Madhya Pradesh project in India. The project is led by CSCEHK and jointly operated with Soma Enterprise Limited.
- Won the bid for the Armada Towers project in Dubai with a total contract amount of AED314 million (approximately HK\$666 million).

## Major Events of the Year 2005 (con't)



### July

- The Company (stock code: 3311) was successfully listed on the Stock Exchange in Hong Kong. This marked a new stage for the business development of the Group and its official advancement to the capital and international markets.
- The works completion ceremony for the development of infrastructure for Penny's Bay Development - Contract 1 was solemnly held, marking the completion of all ancillary facilities at the Disneyland theme park.



### August

- The agreement for the project of the Hyderabad International Airport-Passenger Terminal Building in India was officially signed with a total contract amount of HK\$1,250 million.
- Successfully won the two large KCRC-Kowloon Southern Link Tunnels projects of KCRC with a contract of approximately HK\$1,083 million.
- Got the Wastewater Scheme Logo. The Group's remarkable results in environmental protection were recognized again.
- Announced the first interim results.
- The topping-out ceremony for the Wynn Resorts Macau was solemnly held.



### September

- Cooperated with the Hong Kong Polytechnic University in virtual construction technology to jointly study the applications of virtual construction technology in construction works.
- The commercial residential development project at TWT398 Tai Ho Road, Tsuen Wan, Superstructure won the gold prize of the Building Site Category of Competition on Safe Working Cycle.
- Won various safety prizes in various site events of "Construction Safety Promotional Campaign 2005" jointly organised by organizations such as the Occupational Safety & Health Council of Hong Kong. The commercial residential development project at TWT398 Tai Ho Road, Tsuen Wan, Superstructure won the gold prize of the building construction category.



### November

- The Group held the "Safety Experience Sharing Session for Designated Sub-contractors of the Housing Department and the Safety Management Workshop for Designated Sub-contractors" at the North Point Training Centre. Officiating guests invited on the day included Ms. Fung Y. S., Deputy Director of the Housing Department, and Mr. Pang K. L., Occupational Safety Officer of the Labour Department.

### December

- At the 2005 National Science and Technology Award, the "Construction Works Management Technology Study and System Application" project was awarded the second prize of the National Science and Technology Progress Award (without winner of the first prize).
