Yuen Tin Fan Francis

Mr Yuen, aged 54, is Executive Chairman of the Company and Deputy Chairman of Pacific Century Regional Developments Limited.

He joined the Pacific Century Group in 1996 after an extensive career in investment banking and financial regulatory affairs across Asia. From 1988 to 1991, he was Chief Executive of The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited.

Mr Yuen was also a founding Director of Hong Kong Securities Clearing Company Limited. From 1992 to 1994, he served as a member of the International Markets Advisory Board of the US-based NASDAQ, the second largest stock market in the world.

Mr Allen, aged 51, has been a director of the Company since June 1999. He was re-designated as a Non-Executive Director of the Company on 1 March 2006 and was appointed as a member of the Audit Committee of the Company on 2 March 2006. He is Group Managing Director of Pacific Century Regional Developments Limited and Chief Financial Officer of the Pacific Century Group. He is also an Executive Director of PCCW Limited.

Mr Allen joined KPMG Peat Marwick in 1976 before moving to Occidental Petroleum Corporation in 1980. In 1983, he joined Schlumberger Limited and held key management positions in a number of countries.

As well as serving as Chairman of The Ming An Insurance Company (Hong Kong), Limited and China Reinsurance Company (Hong Kong) Limited, Mr Wang was a Director of CITIC Ka Wah Bank Limited (now known as CITIC International Financial Holdings Limited) and several other companies in Hong Kong.
